WELCOME BACK TO CLASS!

UGA Welcomes Class of 2028

This semester, the University of Georgia welcomed 6,175 first-year students from more than 43,000 applicants. It's one of most academically qualified classes in the university's history, and the numbers are on target with UGA's new <u>strategic enrollment plan</u>.

The incoming class includes students from 463 Georgia high schools, 144 Georgia counties (out of 159), 44 states and 12 nations. Approximately 80% of the first-year students are Georgia residents, a percentage far above that of many other state flagship institutions in the country. This year, 25% of incoming firstyear students are considered first-generation students, which means neither of their parents have earned a four-year college degree.



More than 2,000 transfer students also are beginning their studies at the university this week, an increase of almost 18% from the previous year. Approximately one-fourth of UGA's graduates enter the university as transfer students.

"We are thrilled to welcome this talented and inspiring class of first-year students to the University of Georgia," said President Jere W. Morehead. "I look forward to their contributions to our campus, our state and the world as they pursue their diverse academic and career paths at UGA."



"UGA's incoming class is once again very impressive," said Marisa Pagnattaro, vice president for instruction and senior vice provost for academic planning. "Our focus on student success is designed to meet the ever-changing needs of our students, and we look forward to introducing the Class of 2028 to our world-class faculty and innovative teaching and learning initiatives."

UGA Academic Advisor Wins National Award Ryan Smith, Geog. Academic Advisor, wins Outstanding New Advisor Award



Ryan Smith, academic advisor for Geography and Art in the UGA Franklin College of Arts and Sciences, has been selected as a recipient of the NACADA Outstanding New Advisor Award. Smith received the UGA Outstanding New Advisor Award in spring 2024, which made him UGA's nominee for the global NACADA award. His award will be presented in a ceremony at the NACADA Annual Conference this October.

Established in 1983, the <u>NACADA Global Awards Program</u> honors individuals and institutions making a significant impact on academic advising. NACADA is a representative and advocate of academic advising and those providing that service to higher education. Smith is a 2024 winner of the Outstanding New Advisor Award - Primary Role. UGA advisors have been recognized with multiple Certificate of Merit Awards in recent years and an Outstanding New Advisor Award in 2021-22.

"This is a wonderful distinction not only for Ryan but also for the Office of Student Academic Services, the Franklin College, and UGA as a whole," said Diane Miller. "Ryan is an exceptional advisor who has earned the respect of his faculty and staff colleagues and become indispensable to them as well as his advisees. The consistent excellence of his work and the impact he has on students' lives make him tremendously deserving of this honor."
