

• Summer Graduate School Deadlines

June 20, 2025

Final date to apply for degree/certificate for Summer 2025 graduation.

• Application for Graduation

June 20, 2025

Final date for submitting program of study forms to the Graduate School for graduation in Summer 2025. An approved Advisory Committee form for Master of Arts, Master of Science, and all doctoral Candidates must be on file by this date. (Use Program of Study form G138 in gradstatus.uga.edu.)

• Forms

June 20, 2025

Final date for submitting applications for admission to candidacy to the Graduate School for doctoral candidates who plan to graduate in Summer 2025. If you were not admitted to candidacy prior to January 17, 2025, you must register for 10 hours Summer 2025.

• Application for Admission to Candidacy

June 23, 2025

Final date for submitting requests for transfer of credit, with accompanying transcripts, to the Graduate School for students graduating in Summer 2025.

· Request for Transfer of Credit

June 30, 2025

Final date for electronically submitting one complete copy of a thesis or dissertation for a format check for Summer 2025 graduation. (Note: this is the "first format check" deadline.)

 Format check – Please be aware that this link will send you to ProQuest. All ETD submissions are handled through ProQuest.

July 14, 2025

Final date for receipt of the following by the Graduate School: Final Defense Approval Form & Electronic Thesis & Dissertation Approval Form (all doctoral, MS, MA, MHP, and MLA) and corrected copy of thesis or dissertation document submitted to ProQuest for Summer 2025 graduation. (Note: this is the final format check, final defense approval form, and the release option form for all dissertation and thesis degrees.)

- Final Defense Approval Forms: Doctoral, MA, MS, MHP, MLA
- Final ETD Submission

July 18, 2025

Final date for doctoral students to submit information for the Commencement program for Fall 2025 graduation. (Use the G120 form in <u>gradstatus.uga.edu</u>.) (Note: students graduating in summer have the option to walk in the fall commencement ceremony.)

• <u>Doctoral Graduation Ceremony Information Form (EdD, PhD, DMA, DrPH only!)</u> August 1, 2025

Final date for completing all requirements except submission of theses / dissertations (see earlier deadlines – July 14, 2025). The Graduate School must receive notification concerning removal of incompletes, final examinations, etc., for Summer 2025 graduation. (Note: this does not include grades for courses in which students are currently enrolled.)

- The Torrance Center runs signature annual summer day camps Creative Explorers Camp (CEC) – at the Mary Frances Early College of Education. These weeklong day camps take place on the UGA campus in Aderhold Hall over June-July 2025.
- The camps are attended by 3rd to 5th graders from Clarke County and neighboring school
 districts. Each week is designed around a unique sensory-motor skillset, giving children the
 opportunity to enhance their creative thinking abilities across multiple modalities.
 - o Creativity in Cooking (Jun 9-Jun 13)
 - o Creativity in Music (Jul 12- Jul 16)
 - o Creativity in Art (Jul 21-Jul 25)
 - o Creativity in Words (Jul 28- Aug 1)
- Students enrolled in EDUC 4460S will gain vital experience in devising and implementing
 enrichment-oriented educational programs for young children that are centered on
 creative skill development. In gaining work experience as camp instructors, coordinators,
 and assistants, the course provides students the opportunity to develop wide pedagogically
 relevant skillsets while being directly engaged in societally meaningful work which directly
 aids the local community as its serves to hone creative skills of young children.

• Community Mapping Seeking Undergraduates Research Assistants

The Community Mapping Lab is looking for 2-3 undergraduates who would like to work as research assistants in Fall 2025. CML is currently involved in multiple ongoing projects, and so your work could include the following:

- Brooklyn Cemetery: Doing work documenting families and other notable individuals buried in this historically Black cemetery
- Reese Street storymapping: Continuing archival work developing online guides
 to the Reese Street neighborhood, a once thriving Black neighborhood just to
 the west of downtown. This may involve some oral history/interviewing as well
 as archival work
- Mapping the R-51 urban renewal project: Contributing to an ongoing effort to digitize and analyze records from the R-51 urban renewal project in Athens, which included the section of College St. just north of downtown
- Developing the CML archive: We are trying to create an online archive of materials the lab has created over the year. You would help get that running and start adding materials to it.

Most of this work requires some past experience with GIS and/or ESRI storymaps. But qualitative research skills are also relevant.

Research assistants in CML can get course credit by taking Geog4960R. You can also apply for CURO funding for the fall, which includes a \$1,000 stipend. Past students have generally been successful applying for CURO funding.

• Morehead State University - Instructor of Geography/GIS

The Department of History, Philosophy, Politics, Global Studies & Legal Studies at Morehead State University is currently accepting applications for a full-time, non-tenure track Instructor of Geography/GIS. The anticipated start date is August 11, 2025.

- We are seeking candidates with a master's degree in GIS or Geography (with a GIS certificate or demonstrable proficiency in GIS software). A Ph.D. and prior teaching experience in GIS are preferred.
- The successful candidate will teach 30 credit hours per academic year, including courses in geography, the general education program, and graduatelevel Geography and GIS courses.
- Additionally, the role involves developing and recruiting students into a GIS
 certificate program, with opportunities for cross-departmental collaboration in
 fields such as Agriculture, Earth and Space Science, and Public Administration.
