NOAA Recommends Funding for Sapelo Restoration Project

Collaborative Effort Aims to Address Flooding Through Oyster Reef Restoration

In late July, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Association recommended funding for a new collaborative project aimed at reducing flooding around the Sapelo Island Gullah Geechee community known as Hog Hummock. Like many of Georgia's barrier islands, Sapelo Island and its communities are susceptible to coastal flooding, sea-level rise, and other coastal hazards. With the proposed funding, the Hogg Hummock-based non-profit organization Save Our Legacy Ourself (SOLO) will lead the project with support from the University of Georgia's Institute for Resilient Infrastructure Systems (IRIS) and Shell to Shore, an Athens based oyster shell recycling nonprofit. The project will build a living shoreline and oyster reef designed to bolster the marsh and channel flood waters away from the community.

Maurice Bailey, the founder of SOLO, spoke on the need for the project. "One of our challenges, becoming more noticeable yearly, is the flooding throughout the community in both homes and farmed land. With climate changes, sea level rise, and an unkept maze of historical ditches, these problems will only become more severe until the lands are unusable," Bailey said.

Nik Heynen, Distinguished Research Professor of Geography, summed up the project's capacity to simultaneously protect the community while providing an important learning opportunity for University of Georgia faculty and students. "At this time when the Saltwater Geechee community is being threatened by development and sea level rise, following Geechee leadership and knowledge about how to combat environmental problems in Hogg Hummock is vitally important for scientists and students from the state's largest public university." **Information from this article was sourced from an IRIS press release.**

UGA Students Awarded 2024 AMS Scholarships



Fourth-year students in the Franklin College department of geography and atmospheric sciences program Shania Green and Jada Lamar have been selected to receive 2024 American Meteorological Society Senior Named Scholarships.

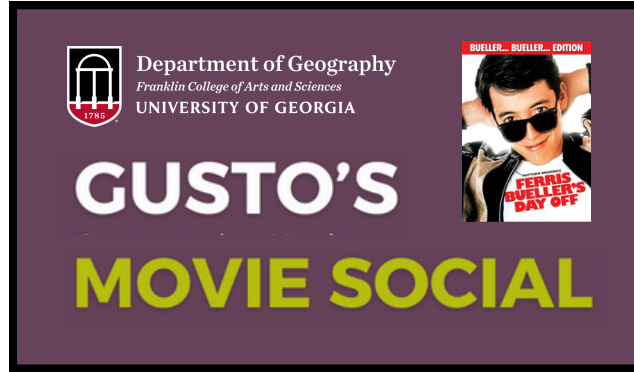



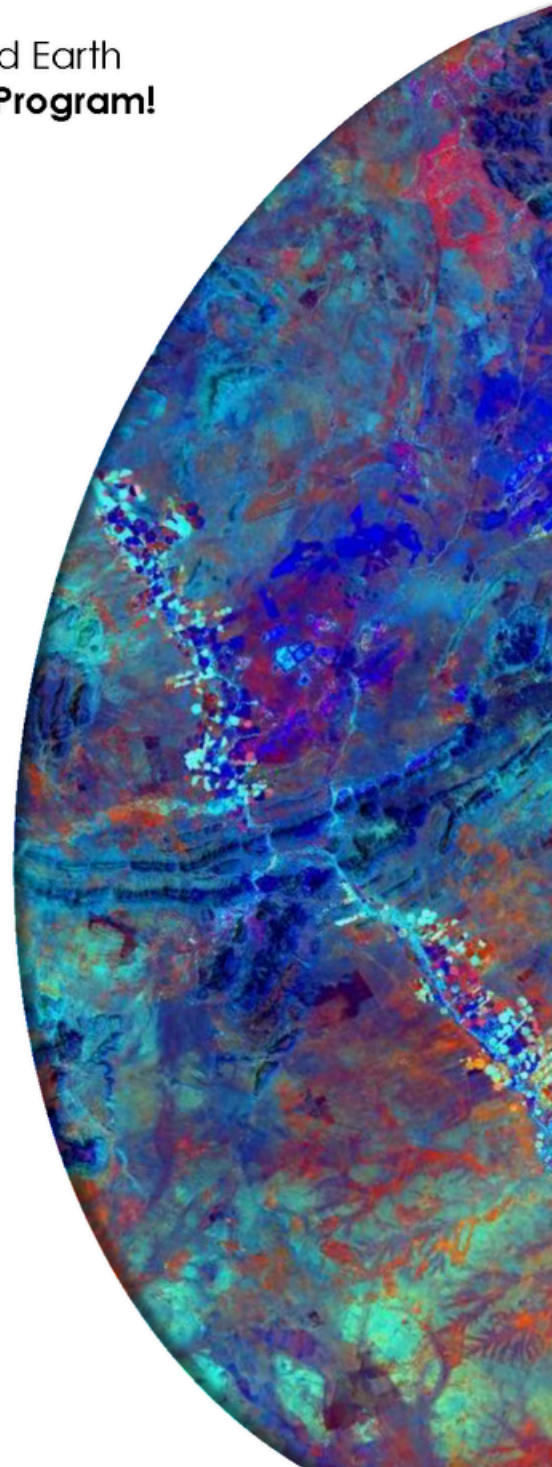

Max Appelbaum's Masters Thesis Observes Heat Island Effect In Augusta



Max Appelbaum

Last week, a local Augusta, Georgia news outlet, [News 12](#), published a story which contained ties to UGA Geography, most significantly, Max Appelbaum's master's thesis - Satellites, Drones, and Cars: An Integrated Approach to Urban Heat Island Observation. Appelbaum's thesis observed the urban heat island effect, the phenomenon in which infrastructure such as roads and buildings absorb daytime heat and radiate it after dark, keeping urban temperatures warmer than surrounding areas.

To observe the heat island effect, Appelbaum selected eight points around Augusta and used satellites, cars, and drones to gather data. The results of his research show heat island effects, especially around the downtown area. The heat island effect is often felt most by vulnerable populations in less affluent areas. Appelbaum's research is being utilized by the [Georgia Climate Project](#) in collaboration with the [Greater Augusta Interfaith Coalition](#) to help determine community solutions for heat related issues.

Appelbaum graduated from UGA's Department of Geography and successfully defended his thesis in Spring 2024 with thesis advisor [Dr. Marshall Shepherd](#) and committee members [Dr. Andy Grundstein](#) and [Dr. Sergio Bernardes](#). Max will pursue his Ph.D. at the University of Wyoming. Appelbaum was also named recipient of the 2023 Department of Energy Savannah River National Research Laboratory (SRNL) BSRA Research Poster Session. Appelbaum's poster, titled "Remote Sensing of the Surface Urban Heat Island to Inform In-Situ Atmospheric Observations" was named best in show. [Read the full News 12 Article here!](#)

John Knox, professor of geography and Josiah Meigs Distinguished Teaching Professor was named the recipient of the University System of Georgia's (USG) 2024 Felton Jenkins Jr. Hall of Fame Faculty Award. According to the USG website, "These system-wide awards will recognize individual faculty and staff for a strong commitment to teaching and student success."

Dr. Knox was officially recognized at the annual Board of Regents' Scholarship Gala on Thursday, September 12, 2024 at Town Stage at Trilith Studios in Fayetteville, GA, where he and other award winners were recognized by the Chancellor, the Regents, and the Presidents of the USG universities.

UGA has had only seven previous winners since this award was created in 1997, the last one in 2015. Dr. Knox is the first recipient in the UGA Department of Geography.

RESEARCH SPOTLIGHT

UGA Geography Researchers Study Algal Blooms with CyanoTRACKER Project



The team is posting pictures from these efforts as it builds data collected to do impactful work on CyanoHABs.

The CyanoTRACKER project, a collaboration between UGA researchers, collects and integrates community reports, remote sensing data and digital image analytics to detect and differentiate between regular algal blooms and Cyanobacterial Harmful Algal Blooms (CyanoHABs). As the frequency and magnitude of CyanoHABs have grown, particularly in the summer months, CyanoTRACKER offers accurate, cost-effective, and targeted monitoring of these events that seamlessly integrates community observations, remote sensing measurements, and advanced multimedia analytics for effective CyanoHABs monitoring.

The CyanoTRACKER team has begun to implement large-scale fieldwork to make cyano monitoring and prediction better as part of the CyanoTracker work. With plans to visit many cyano-prone waterbodies across the continental U.S. in the next 3 months.

With support from NASA, the team recently partnered with Cleveland State University on field work with the University of Wisconsin, Green Bay, to collect radiometric measurements and water samples.

"We have planned and are starting to implement a massive effort for large-scale fieldwork to make cyano monitoring and prediction better as part of the CyanoTRACKER work," said Deepak Mishra, Merle C. Prunty, Jr. Professor, associate head of the department of geography in the Franklin College of Arts and Sciences, and Project P.I. on CyanoTRACKER. "We are partnering with many state universities and state agencies to visit many cyano-prone US waterbodies in the next 3 months."
