GEOAI SEMINAR TODAY: FRIDAY, MARCH 29TH

Join Us in Welcoming Dr. Yuhao Kang to UGA Geography



Yuhao Kang, assistant professor in GIScience and the GISense Lab Lead at the University of South Carolina, will be visiting UGA's Department of Geography on Friday, March 29th to host a GeoAl Seminar titled: "Advancing Human Sense of Place with Large Language Models."

About Dr. Kang: Yuhao Kang is an assistant professor in GIScience leading the GISense Lab at the University of South Carolina. He was a postdoctoral researcher at MIT and received his Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He had working experience at Google X and MoBike. Dr. Kang's research mainly focuses on Human-centered Geospatial Data Science to understand human experience at place and develop ethical and responsible geospatial artificial intelligence (GeoAI) approaches.

By leveraging human-centered geospatial data science, Dr. Kang explores various applications such as public health, real estate, crime, to inform decision-making processes in urban planning. He is the author of 50+ publications with 2300+ Google Scholar citations on journals and conferences in GIS and Urban Studies. He was the recipient for several fellowships and awards, including the Young Researcher Award by the Austrian Academy of Sciences, CaGIS Rising Award, CaGIS scholarship, ICA scholarship, etc. He actively contributed to the GIScience community. He founded the non-profit global education project GISphere with over 20,000 members, served as the associate editor of Computational Urban Science, and board members for the AAG GISS/CyberGIS/Cartography groups and CPGIS.





Undergraduate Research Opportunities with the Community
 Mapping Lab

The Community Mapping Lab has several openings for undergraduates seeking research experience over the summer and fall semesters. Our ongoing projects include the following:

- Eviction mapping: Digitize court records for eviction filings and analyze current trends in evictions in the city. GIS skills not required, but helpful. This can potentially include an internship with the ACC Geospatial Office.
- Reese Street Neighborhood mapping: CML is partnering with individuals in the Reese Street neighborhood, an historic African-American community just west of downtown Athens, to create a historic map of the neighborhood based on the 1958 city directory. This work includes working with partners to develop a storymap of residents during that time period and collecting other relevant historical information. Some GIS skills are necessary for this work, but archival research and/or interviewing may also be part of the work.
- Brooklyn Cemetery: This Black cemetery is located behind Clarke Middle
 School near Alps Road. Previous Community GIS classes worked with Ms.
 Linda Davis and others to develop datasets showing those buried in this
 cemetery. Further work is needed to help tell the story of families found in the
 cemetery and continue improving the accuracy of cemetery records. The work
 includes both GIS data management and archival research skills.

Each of these opportunities can be in summer and/or fall 2024. Students can receive course credit (Geog4960R) for their work and can also apply for funding through the CURO program. CURO's deadlines are April 15th for summer semester and July 1st for fall.

• StoryMapping Queer Climate Justice

Undergraduate research opportunity to work on a Community Geography project with the Astraea Foundation, an LGBTQ+ philanthropy non-profit, to create a "StoryMap" of the first cohort of their Queer Climate Justice grant fund. This includes working collaboratively with grantees to craft a visual narrative representing their work and then using the tools of ArcGIS online to "put it on the map" alongside climate vulnerability indicators. The project aims to help Astraea raise additional funds for this program and uplift the climate experiences of LGBTQ+ people and uplift their leadership in climate justice.

\$500 stipend for 30 hours of work over the summer semester. Flexible schedule.

Postdoctoral Position in AI and Census Microdata, Univ. of Utah

The College of Social and Behavioral Science at the University of Utah is seeking applicants for a Postdoctoral Research Associate with an interest in applying Artificial Intelligence (AI) to US Census data. AI is having far-reaching effects as it moves into everyday systems, such as healthcare, education, policy, immigration, and criminal justice, often with a focus on individualized outcomes.

Interdisciplinary research is critical for developing "responsible" technologies that forward the public interest, recognizing AI as both a technological approach and a social practice (e.g. how humans are classified, how we identify technological problems, how we understand our society). Federal Statistical Research Data Centers, such as the Wasatch Front Research Data Center (WFRDC), located in the Interdisciplinary Exchange for Utah Science (NEXUS), offer a unique resource of census microdata, allowing the exploration of sociodemographic dynamics at an individual level, and there is a significant opportunity to apply AI methodologies to these data.

We seek a researcher interested in developing research that integrates AI methods with the type of microdata held in the WFRDC. The successful candidate for this position will have a record of working with socio-demographic data and AI methods, and a commitment to responsible AI applications.
