RESEARCH SPOTLIGHT

Dr. Deepak Mishra Contributes to New Study on Global Water Quality Monitoring

UGA Geography professor, Associate Department Head, and Small Satellite Research Laboratory Director Dr. Deepak Mishra has shared a new study alongside 76 co-authors from around the globe. The study "GLORIA - A globally representative hyperspectral in situ dataset for optical sensing of water quality" was first published in February 2023 in Nature Scientific Data. According to Dr. Mishra, the purpose of this research is to establish the first global optical dataset for global water quality monitoring with the hope that the dataset will lead to large-scale global water remote sensing monitoring effects. The field data that comprises this research was collected from various inland waterbodies spanning the globe over a period of 30 years.

The culmination of this extensive research is generating significant interest online. A handful of the paper's authors recently penned a <u>blog post in the journal Nature</u> where they introduce the study's findings and also speak to the intensity of the field research that was required for this study. <u>Learn more about Dr. Mishra's research here!</u>

EXPLORING THE CENTER FOR GEOSPATIAL RESEARCH

Students and teachers from the Pope High School Globalization Academy recently toured the CGR/DiGTL for a research immersion experience. During their visit, students learned about developments in remote sensing based on drones and satellites, as well as selected applications in agriculture, cultural heritage preservation, and support to humanitarian works in the Amazon. The visit included immersive and hands-on landscape explorations using the augmented reality sandbox.





• Shell to Shore Internship Opportunities

Shell to Shore is an oyster recycling program based in Athens. They are transporting oyster shells from inland tables to the shore. Their goal is to connect this natural resource to restoration projects on the Georgia coast.

The main responsibilities during the internship include assisting with collecting oyster shells from restaurants weekly in Athens, Augusta and Atlanta as well as helping expand the network of restaurants they work with. Additionally, interns will learn about oyster culture, help expand educational capacity as well as assist finding new sources of funding to expand the project among other opportunities.

• Postdoctoral Opportunity: Remote Sensing Of Agricultural Systems

The Center for Geospatial Research at the Department of Geography and the Department of Statistics at the University of Georgia, in collaboration with the USDA-Agricultural Research Service, are seeking a Postdoctoral Associate to investigate relationships between plant biometrics collected in the field and plant descriptors derived from drone-based remote sensing. The selected candidate will join a team of researchers and will collect, assemble and analyze geospatial datasets including direct field measurements and remotely-sensed observations of plot and field areas in support of long-term agroecosystem research.

The successful candidate will hold a PhD degree with training in plant ecology, agronomy, geography, or related physical sciences, with specific expertise in analytical methods and techniques, including remote sensing and the processing of datasets collected directly in the field.

Interested candidates should send a CV, statement of research interests (no more than two pages) and a copy of graduate transcripts (unofficial transcripts are acceptable) to Dr. Sergio Bernardes (sbernard@uga.edu) and to Dr. Alisa Coffin (alisa.coffin@usda.gov). This is a one-year position renewable for three more years, based on performance and availability of funds. The position is based at the USDA-ARS facility in Tifton, Georgia. Expected start date is Summer/Fall 2023.

Community Mapping Lab Summer Assistantship

The Community Mapping Lab here in Geography has two ongoing projects looking for students over the summer.

The first is work digitizing the 1958 Athens City Directory. A lot of this will be data cleaning on a spreadsheet, but it may also involve some geocoding.

The second involves analysis of data related to evictions in Athens, in coordination with a few local groups including the Athens Housing Advocacy Team.

The expectation would be 5-7 hours of work per week over 10 weeks of the summer term, with some schedule flexibility. GIS/Data wrangling experience preferred but not necessary.
