INTRODUCING: THE WEATHER DAWGS UGA's Student-Run Weather Service Keeps You Ahead of the Storm

Earlier this month, UGA Geography and Atmospheric Sciences professor Dr. John Knox announced the newly reorganized student-run meteorology and weather broadcast group, The Weather Dawgs. For nearly four and a half years, UGA Atmospheric Sciences majors have provided Athens and much of northern GA with comprehensive weather forecasting as "AthensGA Weather," the brainchild of UGA alumni Matt Daniel. Now, with full approval from UGA's Athletics and Marketing/Communications Departments, the student group has rebranded with the intention of expanding their broadcasting capabilities and continuing to develop student's meteorological skills.

According to fourth year Atmospheric Sciences major, P.J. Gudz, The Weather Dawgs provides an essential service to the Northern Georgia region. The two weather forecasting hubs nearest to Athens, Atlanta and Greenville-Spartanburg, are just far enough away to create a meteorological 'blind spot.' The need for quality weather broadcasting in Northern GA was demonstrated when a <u>'killer' EF-4 tornado tore through Newnan GA in March 2021</u>. Two Newnan residents, unable to access local weather channels, turned to the student group's late night YouTube broadcast where student meteorologist William O'Neil warned them of the storm's severity. The couple took shelter per O'Neil's warning just before their house was seriously damaged in the storm. The couple credit the student group with saving their lives.

The Weather Dawgs will produce forecast blogs on their website from Monday-Thursday with additional entries anytime severe weather is expected. Soon, the Weather Dawgs will also post daily weathercasts created using their state of the art studio software and WSI MAX weather graphics systems. They'll continue to pay special attention to severe weather alerts across northern Georgia and will provide videos explaining the science and potential impacts of such meteorological phenomena. 



2023 GLOBE LECTURE

Join us for the Second Colloquium of the Spring Semester!



Taylor Shelton, Assistant Professor in the Department of the Geosciences at Georgia State University, will present the 2023 Globe Lecture on March 17th at the University of Georgia. Shelton's lecture is: "Oddities and Inequalities: Adventures in Mapping Atlanta." According to his Georgia State University profile, Dr. Shelton specializes in GIS, digital geography, urban geography, housing/ land & property, socio-spatial inequality, and geographic thought/ methodology.

"Broadly trained as a geographer, Dr. Shelton's work sits at the intersection of critical human geography and GIS. His research focuses on the variety of ways that urban spaces and social inequalities are represented, reproduced and contested through maps and data.

Dr. Shelton is particularly interested in using mapping to develop alternative understandings of urban social and environmental injustices, especially as it relates to issues of housing and property ownership. But rather than only identifying where social problems - like evictions, vacant properties or speculative investments by absentee corporations - are spatially concentrated, his work strives to map the relational geographies that connect those places where inequality is experienced to the places that produce and benefit from such inequalities. More recently, he has begun applying these same techniques to the city of Atlanta and its broader metropolitan region, as chronicled on his blog, <u>Mapping Atlanta</u>.

Prior to joining Georgia State in 2020, Dr. Shelton held appointments at Mississippi State University, the University of Kentucky and the Georgia Institute of Technology. Before that, Dr. Shelton earned BA and MA degrees in geography from the University of Kentucky and his Ph.D. from the Graduate School of Geography at Clark University."



RESEARCH SPOTLIGHT

New Research Suggests Plant-Only Diets May Not Be Key to Saving the Planet



An entirely plant based diet has long been suggested as the most environmentally friendly way to eat. However, new research from University of Georgia Geography professor Dr. Amy Trauger suggests that a diet of mostly plants and humanely raised meat is likely the most ethical way to eat with regard to the protection of human rights and our environment.

"There's nothing sustainable about this plant-based model," says Dr. Trauger. "It is really just a lot of greenwashing. You really don't have to look very far to see how problematic this narrative is." Dr. Trauger's research focuses on commodities which are produced under the guise of being ethical but may in fact be causing socio-ecological harm. Dr. Trauger's research makes the case for adopting a new ethical framework which includes the limited consumption of animal products.

Dr. Trauger's study discusses the environmentally taxing production of soybean products like tofu and tempeh. Similarly, Dr. Trauger shows that local ecosystems in various countries have been devastated by palm oil production, the industry of which has been denounced for alleged human rights abuses. "People prioritize the lives of livestock and domesticated farm animals over the lives of the people who grow palm oil or soybeans," Trauger said. "Corporations love to market to people that eating this way will make a difference in the world, but it won't."

This study argues that a paradigm shift in the meat production industry could help mitigate climate change. This shift includes raising meat in a way which benefits local ecosystem health, and harvesting that meat on a small scale by a well paid staff with transparent supply chains. "There's definitely an argument for reducing the amount of meat that we eat, but we can get a good deal of our protein needs met with a small amount of animal products like meat or eggs. Meanwhile things like avocados, coconuts, cacao and coffee are plant-based, but they're destroying the environment and livelihoods."





Dr. Fausto Sarmiento, UGA Geography professor and director of the Neotropical Montology Collaboratory, has authored a new book: "<u>Montology Palimpsest: A Primer of Mountain</u> <u>Geographies</u>." The new publication was recently featured in a <u>UGA Today article</u> by Alan Flurry: "With the ecological acceleration and the indigenous revival trend of the present, the need for critical views of the reality of mountain systems has become evident in academic circles, such as the Commission of Mountain Studies of the International Geographical Union, the Mountain Research Initiative and FAO Mountain Partnership."

"<u>Montology Palimpsest: A Primer of Mountain Geographies</u> is a transdisciplinary approach to provide unbiased, decolonial scholarship about mountainscapes as socioecological systems with contributions of chapters covering mountain themes around the world. Fausto Sarmiento, professor of geography in the Franklin College of Arts and Sciences and director of the Neotropical Montology Collaboratory, headed a consilient global discussion to incorporate notions of this new montological perspective to understand epistemes of mountain ecology and their priorities for the conservation of biocultural diversity and identity markers of mountain heritagescapes."
